Following Round 1 of the PANSA Peer Leaders Program applications, there are still places available, so round 2 is now open. Quality applicants will be accepted when they apply.

Each participant has a \$1000 annual scholarship in coaching, officiating or a similar course in the sport and recreation industry, receives ongoing pay to study, gets paid coaching and program delivery hours and other benefits on the way to being ready to work in the industry.

The program combines education, mentorship, specialised advice, best-practice sports delivery and building of other essential skills to complement a person's involvement in the industry.

The PPL program is targeted at the sport and recreation industry, directing the knowledge, skill, and passion of CaLD Australians into the betterment of the industry as today's staff and the future's leaders.

Perth African Nations Sports Association (PANSA) leads the Empower the People Program which is made possible through WA State Government (DLGSC) funding and the support of various sport and community organisations who will inform and guide the program's progress.

PANSA is a charity non-profit, incorporated organisation with a community-focused board and a strong local history. At the base of our organisation, the board is informed by lived experience with our people having come from Africa to Australia in recent decades, bringing a rich and diverse experience of the African continent.

We are dedicated to breaking down barriers and providing life opportunities to African–Australians and our organisation's story is one of ambition, overcoming disadvantage, empowerment and achievement through respect, improvement, friendship, and self-belief. At the heart of our philosophy is social cohesion; we believe it is important for migrants to maintain their identity, while feeling they have a place in the wider Australian community. Sport is a language understood by all and is the key vehicle we use for positive change.

We direct our operations towards African Australians and recently arrived CaLD people because as a community organisation run and overseen by CaLD people, we refer to lived experience and strong relationships with the communities we serve and work with, recognising that a strong and harmonious CaLD community represents the best chance for a future local community with equality, harmony, fairness, and representation at its core. We also recognise that the people we encounter can be empowered to go out into the wider world and influence other places and people with their positive experiences of PANSA. What we do benefits all.

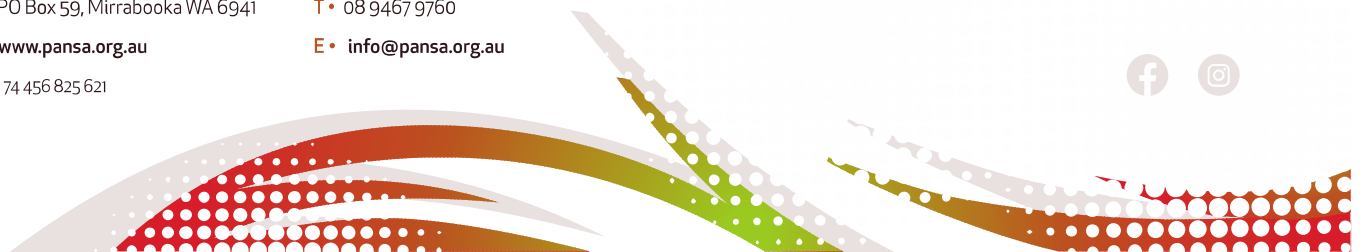
